Dear Dr. Harris:

Please accept my thanks for your letter of the 13th with copy of Stoughton and Stoughton's plan. As always happens when projects require many years for their realization, there have been many modifications introduced into the original idea. Nevertheless, your remark regarding the value of having a master plan toward which to work has much weight. I note that you have located the contour map of the Polytechnic grounds. No doubt you intend to make this available for use here. If you will take it to New York, I will be pleased to receive it when we meet there.

Mrs. Jean Sprinstead Whittemore has written requesting an affidavit regarding the services she rendered as a teacher at the Polytechnic. She wishes a statement regarding the period of time covered by her service, the salary she received and the recognition accorded at that time to the Polytechnic as a public school.
